This is your chapter, your ideas count! Check out the calendar and join us for some rides and get together.



MOTORCYCLE INSURANCE PART 1

Motorcycle Insurance is not required by Florida Law. This is not a good idea because you are still responsible for "liability" should you damage someone else's property or person. An example of this could be that one day you are out riding your motorcycle. You pull up behind a stopped Mercedes at a traffic light but you didn't notice a little oil on the roadway. You slide into the rear of the Mercedes and cave in that nice \$5000.00 plastic bumper. You are now responsible to pay the owner of the Mercedes \$5000.00 to repair the bumper. What if the driver also claims whiplash? How much is that claim going to be for? \$10,000.00? 20,000.00 or more?

Most of you are probably responsible and have at least the basic coverage required for your car by Florida Law which is 10/20/10. That means that you have \$10,000.00 coverage for one person should you injure them. There is \$20,000.00 total for all persons involved in a crash that you injure and \$10,000.00 for damage to the vehicle you strike. With the cost of today's hospital and medical expenses, and the cost of vehicle repairs, is that basic coverage really enough? If you do more damage than the limits of your Motorcycle Insurance Policy, you are responsible the pay the difference. If you cannot afford to pay the difference a judge can suspend your driver's license for both motorcycle and car until you make restitution.

The limits of a motorcycle or car insurance policy is totally up to you. Of course, the more coverage limits you want the more your yearly premium will be. One way to get twice the coverage and save a little money on your yearly premium is to get what is called "stacked" insurance. That means if you only have 10/20/10 insurance on your motorcycle and 10/20/10 insurance on your car, should you become liable for crash damage, you now stack those two coverage figures and actually have 20/40/20 dollars' worth of coverage. "Stacking" can only be done if both your motorcycle and car is with the same company. You can't price shop and purchase insurance for you motorcycle with one company and your car insurance with another company and then want to "stack" the coverage. The amount of monetary value for the policy I used as an example was the bare minimum Florida Law requires for your car. In today's economy much higher limits would be more practical.

Next month in "PART 2" of my article. I will discuss with you how to protect yourself from the "Uninsured" or the "Under Insured Motorist".

Chapter Ride Coordinator and Educator Corner Claudia Vega

I found this article in my AAA magazine and though it is a little dated, I still thought it was an interesting and good article.

As if it is not bad enough that we have to worry about drivers that are distracted by cell phones or impaired with the use of alcohol and / or prescription medication, we also have to worry about marijuana use.

Impaired Driving: Marijuana Use

AAA's initial efforts focused on drinking and driving. Later their scope broadened to include the impact of prescription medications. Recently, with marijuana use legalized to some extent in nearly half the states, AAA's efforts have expanded to include studying its impact on drivers as well.

After alcohol and tobacco, marijuana is the most popular recreational drug in the U.S. with an estimated 14 million Americans smoking it regularly. In a roadside survey conducted by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration showed that more than 12 percent of drivers had marijuana in their systems on weekend evenings, an increase of nearly 50 percent in recent years.

Unfortunately, research into the effects of marijuana on driving ability is trailing the passage of laws legalizing its use. There is no standardized road test for THC (the active ingredient in marijuana) comparable to a breathalyzer test for alcohol, and no nationwide legal standard exist for THC concentration in blood like the .08 percent threshold for alcohol.

AAA is working hard to close this gap by sponsoring research into the THC level at which crash risk increases significantly and also whether marijuana impaired driving has increase in Washington State since the drug was legalized there in 2014.

In addition, AAA has been hosting impaired driving summits inviting local law enforcement, judges, attorneys and elected officials to participate in forums that identify solutions and best practices. These summits focus on the big picture of impaired driving, addressing alcohol, marijuana and prescription medications as well as other illegal drugs.

The portion of drivers who consider people driving after using illegal drugs to be a very serious threat was 56 percent.

P.S. Due to the Covid-19 virus I have decided to put my plans for Ray on hold. Unfortunately Palm Beach County is only in phase 1 which still has a lot of restrictions. So what I had hoped to do to celebrate Ray in November has been changed to after the first of the year. I do not have a date as of yet, but I will let you know as soon as I have everything in place. I hope you will still join me in celebrating Ray's life and reminiscing about all the good times we had together.














Fall District Ride-In 2020

has a planned ride around the Daytona Beach Loop after the Rally. Some of us are


