It's that time of year again. Afternoon showers are here. Be prepared! Make sure you pack a rain suit in your bike or bikes if you have more than one. It is easier to put a rain suit in each bike rather than transferring your rain suit around each time you change bikes. There is too much of a chance that you might forget to do so. Alter you riding habits when it is raining. Slow down! Visibility is limited when the rain is hitting you in the face. The water staying on your windshield, face shield and/or glasses is limiting your ability to see as far as needed to avoid obstacles. Increase you following distance. You don't want to have to stop in a hurry and risk sliding on the wet roadway. Remember when you do stop or slow around intersections there is a buildup of oil in the center of the lane that floats to the surface when it rains. This area is extremely slippery especially at the beginning of the rain. If you have to ride on the interstate use the right lane so the high-speed idiots (cars, trucks or motorcycles) can go flying by you. Expect to get splashed as they pass so you are not caught off guard. Ride in the center of the right lane. Thanks to the heavy trucks, the center of the right lane is the highest point with no or less water so that is where you need to be. A two-wheel motorcycle or Trike can hydroplane. Don't let this freak you out if it happens. If it does happen don't go for the brakes. Just roll off the throttle and let your machine settle itself down and regain traction. Remember most Florida rains have a short part of a heavy downpour. It is best to pull into some shelter and wait out the heavy stuff. Your cell phone is a good source to look at the weather Doppler and plan your route accordingly. Sometimes you can go a few miles out of your way and avoid the rain altogether.

Expect to get caught in afternoon rains this time of the year and plan and ride accordingly.

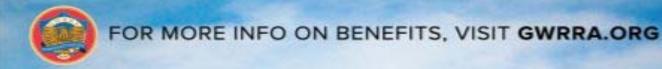

CHAPTER RIDE COORDINATOR and EDUCATOR CORNER

IS IT HOT ENOUGH FOR YOU YET?

As we enter into the month of August all I can think about is the start of school. The kids go back to school here in Palm Beach County on August 10th. With students returning to actual school classrooms, the increase in traffic will begin. Especially with those big yellow buses on the road again. It is very easy NOT to be seen if you are anywhere near one of those buses. Also, parents are rushing to take their child to school will NOT be looking for you. We need to remember to be very careful riding near and in school zones in the morning and afternoons.

This month I am taking some information again from "MCN Street Strategies – A Survival Guide for Motorcyclists" by David L. Hough. This month we are discussing blowouts.

HOT CORDS

Last Month's Low Tire Pressure Can Turn into Today's Blowout

You and your riding companion are three days into a trip and almost a thousand miles from home now. Your touring machine is loaded to the limits with clothing and camping gear plus some tools and spares. You're amazed at how well the loaded bike handles at speed, now that you've gotten used to the extra weight, and you're very please that the bike seldom needs any maintenance.

But over the past couple of days you've noticed a wiggly feel from the rear tire, and you finally decide to pull off at the next rest area to check it. Even though the tire looks a little soft, you don't see any holes or nails. The tread blocks have some strange worn edges, but there's still plenty of rubber and no exposed cords. You suspect the strange feel is just from the extra load, yet decide to have the tire checked anyway if you happen to find a dealer along the way.

Five minutes after leaving the rest area, there's a sickening *bang!* and the rear end starts to wiggle from side to side. Your rear tire has blown, so you ease off the gas, and head for the shoulder. But as your speed drops below 40 mph, the rear end starts to jerk more violently, and you're barely able to bring everything to a stop without dropping the machine. Now you're miles from the rest area where you could've called for help,

When you first notice a wiggling sensation in a tire, pull off the road and try to diagnose a problem. But the damage could have started months before if you allowed your tires to lose air pressure yet continued to ride on them. Underinflated tires can flex enough to heat the cords to destructive temperatures. With an extra load at freeway speeds, it is only a matter of time before a damaged tire comes apart. It's essential to check your tire's pressure with an accurate gauge before each day's ride, especially on long trips. Remember that increased loads require slightly higher tire pressure.

Medic First Aid sent me this blog as I am an instructor. I thought it was something good to share with all of you.

Think how this advice can be applied to you when you are riding your motorcycle in the heat.

WHO IS MOST SUSCEPTIBLE TO HEAT - RELATED ILLNESS?

As we move into some of the warmest months of the year, heat-related illness should be on everyone's radar.

Heat-related illness occurs when a person's body isn't able to cool itself through sweating and heat loss into the air. Most commonly, a person becomes dehydrated in environments where there's a high temperature with high humidity and no breeze.

There are three types of heat-related emergencies:

Heat Cramps – signs include heavy sweating and painful muscle cramps in the abdomen, arms and legs

Heat Exhaustion – signs of heat cramps plus intense thirst, weakness, faintness, headache, dizziness, nausea, vomiting and pale, cool skin.

Heat Stroke – signs of heat exhaustion plus a high body temperature, confusion, slurred speech, seizures, fast breathing and pulse, severe headache or unresponsiveness.

Each of these heat-related emergencies is progressive, meaning symptoms will continue to get worse without intervention.

So, it's important to recognize signs of heat-related illness and treat it early before it becomes life-threatening.

The people most at risk for heat-related illness are those who work or exercise outdoors in the heat (this includes motorcycle riding).

Vulnerable groups that have poor heat tolerance include older adults aged 65 and over, young children and anyone with existing medical conditions (sound like anyone you know?)

Additionally, a person with heat exhaustion is more susceptible to severe heat illness. So, they shouldn't return to physical activity the same day as symptoms can return and escalate to a life threatening emergency.

PREVENTING HEAT-RELATED EMERGENCIES

Prevention is the key when you are in the heat. Plan ahead for hot and humid conditions by taking the following precautions:

- Take time to acclimate to the heat by gradually increasing workloads and taking frequent breaks
- Drink fluids before, during and after physical activity.
- Perform the heaviest work during the coolest part of the day.
- Dress appropriately and protect yourself from the sun.
- Move to a cool area and give first aid to anyone who is developing signs of heat-related illness

MOTORIST AWARENESS IS EVERY WHERE by Claudia Vega

Is this going to be the next thing we are going to have to worry about and watch out for while riding our motorcycles on the road?

Driven to Distraction: (a AAA Living article)

Could some vehicles technology features be both lifesaving and potentially hazardous? *Apparently* so.

Researchers at the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety working with the Virginia Tech Transportation Institute have discovered that long term use of assistive technology can encourage overreliance by drivers. On the other hand, those who are new to such systems are less likely to be disengaged and distracted.

High-tech systems like adaptive (or "radar") cruise control and lane – keeping assist have a lot to offer. "But they should never replace an attentive and engaged driver", says Matt Nasworthy, public affairs director, AAA – The Auto Club Group. "Being focused on the road can save your life"

So take advantage of the assistive driving features, but never forget that you're still in charge of the vehicle.

Could assistive driving technology be a threat to us on a motorcycle? Could this be the new thing that distracts drivers just like cell phones? What do you think?
