We need to setup some rides this month. At the gathering tomorrow night – we will discuss some places to go. I know Elaine Flores has an idea!







TIME TO GET REAL

Did you know if you're flying domestically on or after October 1, 2020 you may need a new type of personal identification? This form of ID or License is known as the "Real ID" and it requires more documentation to obtain than a standard driver's license.

Not everyone will need a Real ID. You won't need it for driving or voting, but you will need it for flying commercially or visiting a military base, nuclear facility or federal building that requires identification.

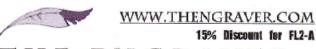
If you don't have a Real ID by October 1^{st} you can use alternative IDs, such as a passport, passport card, permanent resident card or military ID. An enhanced driver's license, issued by some states – Florida is one of them – is also acceptable.

Tip: Want to check whether your current driver's license is compliant? Real IDs generally have a star at the top of the card. If you have renewed your Florida driver's license in recent years, your license should have the gold star on it.

MOTORCYCLE INSURANCE - PART 2

Here is another thing to consider. About 25% of the vehicles you interact with every day on the road either have only the basic 10/20/10 coverage or "no" insurance at all. You might wonder how someone can purchase their vehicle tags without proof of insurance? It is unfortunately pretty easy to do. They go to one of the pay-by-month insurance companies and buy the first months' worth of insurance. They then go and purchase their vehicle tag. After that they stop making their monthly payments and are driving for the next 11 months with no insurance. What's going to happen to you if they hit you?

To protect yourself form your bodily injury costs you must purchase what is called "Uninsured Motorist Coverage" also referred to "Under Insured Motorist Coverage". That coverage will pick up the additional costs once the other persons limits have been paid if they only had 10/20/10 and your medical costs are above that, or they had no insurance. It is true that if you are injured in a crash, and there is no or inadequate motorcycle or automobile insurance, that your medical insurance such as Medicare, VA, Humana, Blue Cross, etc. would pay your medical bills. If the injuries you sustained at the fault of another person you are intitled to additional compensation. This is what you here on all of the TV and radio commercials. The most prominent in Florida is M & M. (I think you know who that is.) The commercials will say that if the crash wasn't you fault intitled to monies for "Pain and Suffering", "Loss of Wages" and "Change of Lifestyle". This is all true but only if you are there is money—available for the lawyer to go after. Your Health Insurance Medical Provider is not responsible to pay anything more than what is called "Making You Whole Again". That means they only pay the medical bills. So where does all of that "big money" come from, they talk about in the commercials? That big money is only available if you are lucky enough to be injured by someone who has a lot of Automobile Insurance Coverage or a lot of Personal Money. Do you really want to bank on that chance? The only way to protect yourself so there is some big money available is to purchase the "Uninsured Motorist Coverage" from your own insurance company. Pick an amount of money that you feel would be adequate should you be injured badly and could not work anymore of if you are retired would compensate you for your physical loss. You contact your agent and tell them what that figure should be and he/she will tell you how much your yearly Remember when you are deciding on how much that monetary figure should be allow for the fact that if your case goes to court, your lawyer gets 40% of your settlement money.

RIDES AND RIDING CLASSES

Hello to all! We hope everyone is well. We had an opportunity to attend the Georgia Rally on October 8th. We rode the Thursday afternoon ride. It was well organized, safe, and a lot of fun. There were more rides and activities planned for Friday and Saturday. Unfortunately, Hurricane Delta was forecasted to make land fall on Friday. We decided to ride back home to Tampa on Friday morning with the uncertainty of what the weather would be as the hurricane got closer. As it turned out we just missed the rain generated by the outer bands which stretched into Georgia. All communications reference the classes should be between Chapter Members and their respective Chapter Director and/or CSEA. I would only like there to be communications reference the class to be between me and the Chapter Directors and/or CSEAs. I will need the Name and Member Number of those who wishes to take the class so I can properly check their Level Status requirements to insure they are taking the appropriate class.

Chapter Ride Coordinator and Educator Corner Claudia Vega

AHH! OCTOBER - MY FAVORITE MONTH!

October has always been my favorite month. Ray and I were married in October 44 years ago. Before Ray started working at a school and had to follow the school schedule we used to travel during October. October seemed to have the best riding weather and the best time for riding in the mountains. And of course the fall colors were always beautiful. I hope that if you are traveling to Georgia for their Riding Rally or traveling to Mississippi for their Medieval Madness Rally that you will have the great October weather and maybe even see some great fall colors.

The following information is from David L. Hough's "MCN Street Strategies – A Survival Guide for Motorcyclists"

DOUBLE TROUBLE

A Second Left-Turner Can Be Worse Than the First

You've been using the bike more and more to commute to work because it saves time and frustration. Commuting in traffic has provided you with a lot of reminders to watch for jaywalking pedestrians, drivers running red lights and trucks swerving partially into your lane. You are especially aware of left turning cars at intersections. This afternoon you're on your way home, riding a four-lane arterial. Traffic is lighter than normal, so you're able to ride a little faster than the posted limit.

Approaching an intersection, you observe a sport utility vehicle (SUV) facing the opposite direction about to turn left. You have the green light. But you predict the driver might turn left in front of you anyway, so you roll off the gas and move left to give yourself more room. Sure enough, the SUV driver does turn left in front of you, and you get back on the gas to continue through the intersection, silently complimenting yourself on your traffic skills.

But suddenly the van that was behind the SUV in the left turn lane begins to accelerate and turn. You quickly roll off the throttle and reach for the front brake lever as the van driver suddenly sees you, panics, and jams on the brakes. You're still braking as hard as you can when your front wheel thuds into the side of the van and you're thrown over the top.

When you are watching for left-turners, it's smart to be prepared in case they decide to turn in front of you and to move over to give yourself more room in case they do, but you should predict that a second driver might also attempt a quick left turn. Yes, that van driver in this scenario was at fault. Such a driver may not see you, or not realize you are approaching as quickly as you are. But all in all, you're the one who gets injured if he or she hits you.

Remember that riding at a faster speed makes it more difficult for other drivers to judge your approach speed and also increases your stopping distance. You should be in the habit of squeezing the front brake lever lightly when approaching intersections to reduce reaction time and dry the discs. Even if you have the green light, you should be squeezing the front brake to slow down and be prepared for a possible quick stop.






Fall District Ride-In 2020
