everyone you meet. It's not hard. Hold doors open, say thank you more often, stop and let people cross just be nice. Treat people how you would like to be treated.



Now when I think of March, I think of the Florida District Rally. It is coming up sooner than you think.





# Chapter Ride Coordinator and Educator Corner By Ray & Claudia Vega

It is hard to believe we are into February already. Chapter FL2-A has lots of rides on the calendar for the month starting with a ride on Saturday, February 1<sup>st</sup> for the "best pie ever" (cancelled due to weather) and ending the month with a unique Ride Around the State. So make sure you check out the calendar and plan on riding with us for lots of FUN!

We still have a couple of spaces available in the **TRC – Trike Riding Course**. It is being offered on Sunday, **February 9, 2020** beginning at **8:00 am**. Classroom portion will be held at the Safety Council of PBC followed by the range portion in Wellington.

For more information and to sign up, please see me at the February 3<sup>rd</sup> Chapter gathering. A \$30.00 deposit it needed to reserve your spot.

Whether you are riding locally or on the road traveling on vacation – this article will fit the situation when ever you are on a multi-lane interstate.

This information is from David L. Hough's "MCN Street Strategies – A Survival Guide for Motorcyclists."

## CENTER STRIKES Remember That Loose Debris Gets Pushed to the Center of the Lane

You're riding in heavy traffic with your defenses on full alert. All three lanes are **crowded with cars**, and you're especially **attentive to vehicles** around you that might suddenly change lanes or stop. You maximize your road space by riding in the **center of your lane**. To discourage another driver from suddenly changing lanes right in front of you, you close up the gap, but you compensate for the too-close following distance by looking over and around the vehicles ahead to spot hazards, and **cover the clutch and front brake lever**.


Suddenly, a large brick appears from under the car ahead, exactly in the center of the lane. Before you can even think about swerving, the bike's front wheel is vaulted upward, then the rear end is thrown sideways as the rear tire also ricochets off the spinning brick. You barely manage to avoid a spill, but the bike is now wobbling. Working your way to the side of the road, you discover that both rims are severely dented and the tires are going flat.

Sometimes you can't avoid getting boxed into traffic situations that don't allow an adequate view of the road surface. While it is wise to scrutinize traffic ahead and prepare for a quick stop, riding in the center of the lane exposes you to surface hazards such as wooden blocks, potholes, pavement breaks, grease strips or bricks, and I am going to add what we encounter often here in Florida - "rubber gators" which four wheeled vehicles can straddle. When the close proximity of traffic prevents you from having an adequate view of the street surface ahead, you might consider riding in one of the wheel tracks rather than the center of the lane.

Let's discuss this at the next Chapter gathering – bring me your questions and stories when you were in this situation. In the mean time let's ride and have some FUN!

A recent motorcycle crash in Sarasota involving five motorcycles was what inspired me to write this article. The way the news report read was that there was a group of motorcycles riding on the interstate. The lead rider lost control of his motorcycle while passing a tractor trailer truck, fell off his motorcycle and struck the wheel of a truck and was killed. The next four motorcyclists then lost control of their motorcycles and fell off of their bikes. Three of them went to the hospital.

So my question to you is this: Ignorance or Arrogance? Ignorance as defined by the dictionary is simply "the lack of knowledge." This would include not knowing "how to ride, where to ride, and what to do should something go wrong." The 1981 Hurt Report, whose findings are still true today, stated that in 80% of motorcycle crashes the rider did not do anything to avoid the crash.

The news story did not state the exact cause the first rider went down but it could have been something as simple as being too close to the tractor trailer truck he was passing and getting startled by the sudden wind blast that often occurs. That cause could fall under the "Ignorance" category for being too close to the truck and not anticipating the wind blast. How about now seeing how the cause might fit in the "Arrogance" category. We have all seen it. The riders with the bold attitude of: "This is my road, I have a right to be here, and I am going to intimidate everyone to get out of my way" (usually by excessive exhaust noise and purposely riding too close to other vehicles they are passing).

We really don't know the reason of the first rider going down at this point but it was probably one of the examples I have just described. How about the next four riders who went down? Obviously they were all following too close to the lead bike to properly react. Again, why were they following too close: "Ignorance or Arrogance"?

We can all make mistakes through "Ignorance" but let's not contribute to the possibility of crashing by adding "Arrogance."

#### MOTORIST AWARENESS IS EVERYWHERE

At the Chapter Conference Ray and I attended the breakout session for Motorist Awareness. It is very obvious that Nate and Danelle Kinion, our District Motorist Awareness Coordinators, are very passionate about Motorist Awareness. Once again they handed out goodie bags containing pamphlets and other materials. While checking out the goodie bag I came across a pamphlet, that I am sure has been around for awhile, but one that I had not noticed before. What was different about this Motorist Awareness pamphlet it was written for the motorcycle rider / co-rider. It's called "Self Defense for Riders – Riders are Dying to be Seen".

Here are some of the highlights from this Motorist Awareness pamphlet:

#### SELF DEFENSE FOR RIDERS – RIDERS ARE DYING TO BE SEEN

Here are some of the ways to increase your safety & visibility while on the road.

#### Be Visible – Be Colorful! Help Motorists See You

Studies show that silver, white, yellow and high visibility colors are the most visible colors on the road. Black is the most difficult to see, especially at night. Brightly colored jackets, helmets and riding pants increase your visibility and safety

#### Light It Up

- HEADLIGHTS turn your headlights on high beam during the day. Modulating headlights also increases visibility and are legal in all 50 states.
- BRAKE LIGHTS flash your brake lights several times before you stop. Brake light deceleration devices are available and they warn motorist that you are preparing to slow down or stop.
- TURN SIGNALS we all know how to use turn signals, but make sure you turn them off after a turn is complete. Motorists don't always know that many motorcycles do NOT have self-cancelling turn signals.

### Be Noticed! Lane Positioning is Critical in Traffic. Make Sure You Are Not in a Driver's Blind Spot! HORN – use it to get attention, but don't rely on it. Some motorcycle horns can't be heard over traffic or

stereo systems.

- LANE POSITIONING position yourself for maximum safety and visibility and make sure other drivers can see you in their mirrors!
- GROUPS riding with a group can be safer than riding alone if done correctly. Small groups of 5 to 7 riders are the safest. Impatient motorists may want to pass a group of riders if the group is too large, merging can become dangerous!

#### Ride Safe!

EDUCATION – there are classes available for both new and advanced riders. Many insurance companies reward riders for taking classes by discounting the cost of insurance. Gold Wing Road Riders Association provides their members with riding classes, practice sessions and seminars.
